# ARRIVAL & PARKING

Staff will greet you and assist with getting you checked-in! Prior to arrival an email will be sent to registration contacts with more details on parking.

## CHECK-IN

After you find a parking spot you will be directed to the Check-In location. There you will turn in your paperwork, receive a schedule, youth t-shirt(s) and campsite assignment.

# MEALS AND FOOD

All meals at Camp will be served in relation to current CDC guidelines and regulations. Meals begin at lunch on Day 1 of Camp and conclude with lunch on Day 2 of Camp. If you have any medical dietary restrictions, please communicate them to the Oliver Dupree (Oliver.Dupree@scouting.org) no less than 2 weeks before your session.

## MEALS AND FOOD

# GENERAL INFORMATION

## **CHECK-IN**

## ***Paperwork NEEDED***

### **Overnight Camp**

Check-In runs 9 AM to 11:30 AM on Day 1 of Camp. To facilitate this process, we encourage leaders to check-in the entire unit once all have arrived at camp.

Scouts registered individually should check-in and check-out at the registration table with their parent or guardian.

After check-in, campers set up in the assigned campsite. Camp staff will be available to assist, if needed. The schedule begins immediately after opening flag ceremony

### **Day Camp**

Check-In begins at 8 AM each day and the Opening Ceremony begins at 8:45 AM. Program begins at 9 AM and concludes at 4 PM daily. Check-In on day 1 may take more time. To facilitate this process, we encourage leaders to take attendance and then check-in the entire unit at the registration table. This is also the best method at the time of check-out. Individual Scouts registered should check-in with the parent or guardian that is also attending the Day Camp at the registration table.

### **1) 2 COPIES OF HEALTH FORMS**

Required for all participants, youth and adults. Participants on camp less than 72 hours only need parts A & B.

### **2) CURRENT YOUTH PROTECTION**

Required for all adults on camp, no exceptions will be made. Please have a printed copy.

### **3) UNIT ROSTER**

The leader in charge needs to bring a complete roster that indicates all youth and adults in camp including a daily schedule of part-time adults as well.

### **4) MEDICATION & ALLERGY INFO**
